SUNNAH OF THE WEEK





The history department led engaging sessions on the historical significance of Masjid Al-Aqsa, helping students connect with its rich past and understand its importance in the Muslim world.


In English, students expressed their thoughts and emotions through poetry, creating heartfelt pieces that reflected their understanding and appreciation of Al-Aqsa.

The students considered the psychological impacts of advertising, the importance of packaging and colour themes to suit a product's promotional message.

ONLINE SAFETY



To help keep your daughter safe online, we will be including bitesize information in our termly newsletter to help you stay informed about how to help to keep your daughter safe online.

WhatsApp Group Warning

Whilst WhatsApp has an age rating of 13+ (recently lowered from 16), an investigation by the BBC has found that children as young as nine have been added to WhatsApp groups and seen inappropriate content.

If your daughter is using WhatsApp, check their group settings as by default, group privacy settings are set to everyone, which means anyone can add your daughter to a group without their approval.

You can change this setting to 'My contacts' so only contacts can add them to groups. If someone who is not a contact wants to add them to a group, then they will need to send them an invite.

Supporting your child to stay safe online

The school network has very strong safeguards to prevent children accessing inappropriate material but children are likely to have fewer barriers when accessing the internet at home.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS





Implications of Poor Attendance

Poor attendance (below 96%) is one of the single biggest blocks to student learning, having consequences not only for their achievement at school, but also their future life chances.

Implications for your child

There is strong evidence to show that where an individual students' attendance is below 96% it will have a detrimental effect on their achievement, becoming increasingly damaging as their attendance percentage becomes lower.






SCHOOL TARGET

- Loss of learning gaps in knowledge and skills, and sense of 'not understanding'
- Academic underachievement
- · Difficulty making friends
- Loss of confidence and self-esteem
- Impaired socialisation for work

The creeping effect of school absence

Many students do not realise how, over missing 1-2 days through the year (or arriving a few minutes late each day) accumulates and the impact it has on their learning, progress, achievement and success over time.



Punctuality Matters Too.

Missed minutes = missed learning = missed opportunities.

- Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:
- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 days lost each year
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent 19 days a year


